What's new?

- Most of the campus local OPACs are now included in the UC-eLinks menu window
- Citation Linker forms were developed with guidance from RSC/IAG and are available for use on your campus websites as stand alone forms or part of your ILL pages
- Copy and paste citation service was developed with guidance from HOPS
- Google Scholar includes UC-eLinks

Who is doing it on the campuses and how?

- Campus instances are being actively maintained by your UC-eLinks liaisons. A list of the UC-eLinks liaisons is available at <http://www.cdlib.org/inside/projects/uc-elinks/roster.html>
- UCB and UCSB are using the UC-eLinks generated A-Z journal lists
- Citation linker as a stand-alone form has been included on the UCB Bioscience and Natural Resources Library "Electronic Resources" webpage, the UCR Library "Find Article" webpage and the UCI Libraries "Online Research" webpage
- UCD, UCI and UCSB are using the Copy and Paste service in production. The inclusion of new services, such as Copy and Paste citation, are campus decisions
- UCB and UCI are using RefWorks in production. The inclusion of targets, such as EndNote, RefWorks, Google and Google Scholar, are campus decisions

Why should you care?

- UC-eLinks is heavily used by the UC community.
- Some numbers from one week (March 6 – 12) this spring:
 - 145,117 clicks on the UC-eLinks button
 - Top five databases: PubMed, PsycINFO, Web of Science, Expanded Academic Index, and BIOSIS Previews
 - Top five full text targets: ScienceDirect, PsycArticles, JSTOR, Synergy, and Expanded Academic Index
 - MELVYL is the most frequently used target.
